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RE: Ohio's Home Sale Activity Report - February 2006

Ohio's housing market - spurred by record sales activity in February - is on a record pace for the first two months of the year, reports the Ohio Association of REALTORS®.

"The level of sales activity continues to surpass our most optimistic expectations," said Darlene Breen, President of the Ohio Association of REALTORS®. "Ohioans continue to take advantage of the favorable interest rates and array of housing options in every price category at a remarkable pace."

"Consumers remain sold on the idea that it's a great time to make the American Dream of homeownership a reality," Breen added. "Our housing market continues to be a true bright spot in Ohio's economy."

Statewide sales of new and existing homes (January-February) totaled 15,346, a 5.2 percent increase from the 14,589 sales posted during the two-month period in 2005, which previously served as the market's best-ever.

The state's average sales price (January-February) of \$146,141 nearly mirrors the \$147,269 average posted during the period last year. The total dollar volume of \$2.2 billion is 4.4 percent ahead of the \$2.1 billion posted in 2005.

Sales in February 2006 reached 8,393, a 7.1 percent increase from the 7,834 sales posted in February 2005. (Note: sales figures for the Toledo market were unavailable. However, the 8,393 sales posted in February 2006 eclipse the month's prior record of 8,387 - which includes Toledo's sales - posted a year ago.)

The 35,000-member Ohio Association of REALTORS®, the largest professional trade organization in the state, calculates its home sale figures based on statistics provided by the Multiple Listing Services (MLS) throughout Ohio. Participating MLSes include: Ashland, Athens, Cincinnati, Columbus, Centralized Real Estate Information Services, Dayton, Firelands, Greater Portsmouth, Heartland, Knox, Lancaster, Licking, Mansfield, Marion, Northern Ohio Regional Multiple Listing Service, Scioto Valley, Toledo, West Central, Western Regional Information Systems & Technology and Zanesville. The report reflects reported closings by MLSes, including new and existing single-family homes and condominiums/co-ops.

{NOTE: There might be a slight variance between the reported number of sales contained in this release and actual activity in the various markets due to OAR's early reporting requirement. Check with contacts in the particular market.}
